

BLACK RIVER COWL

Materials:

186 yards / 170 m of super bulky yarn
(Suggested yarn: Laine 19 from Peace and Wool: 2 skeins)
US 19 Needles (15 mm)
Tapestry needle

Finished Measurements: 11 inches (28 cm) wide and 63 inches (160 cm) circumference

Gauge: 8 stitches and 13 rows = 4 inches (10 cm) in pattern stitch

Pattern:

The pattern is made on 10 rows and is a combination of garter stitch, stockinette stitch and dropped stitch.

For dropped stitch, you knit the stitch as normal, but instead of just wrapping the yarn around the needle once, you wrap it two or three times.

Then, on next row, you purl the stitch and slide the extra wraps off the needle.

Row 1: Slip the 1st stitch on right needle and knit all stitches.

Row 2: Repeat row 1.

Row 3: Knit 1, then knit dropped stitches, wrapping the yarn **twice** around the needle until the end of row.

Row 4: Purl the 22 stitches sliding the extra wrap off the needle.

Row 5: Slip the 1st stitch on right needle and knit all stitches

Row 6: Repeat row 5.

Row 7: Knit one first dropped stitch, wrapping the yarn **twice** around the needle, then knit dropped stitches, wrapping the yarn **three times** around the needle until the end of row.

Row 8: Purl the 22 stitches sliding the extra wrap off the needle.

Row 9: Slip the 1st stitch on right needle and knit all stitches

Row 10: Repeat row 9



Directions:

Cast on 22 stitches.

Repeat ten times the pattern.

Stretch out your knit after each repetition of pattern. (One pattern is about 6,3 inches)

Bind off and weave in ends.

With your tapestry needle, seam the Cast-On edge and the Bind-Off edge together.
